is the opportunity for self-directed learning.

Self-directed learning is active learning whereby the student takes the initiative. It's a very successful method because it fosters self-motivation, an understanding of one's learning style, and persistence.

Online learning courses have become a popular platform for self-directing learning. Mango Languages is a tutorial for foreign language instruction. It's provided by the state of Rhode Island. You can find it on our <u>webpage</u>.

If online learning interests you, take a look at <u>Universal Class</u>. There are hundreds of courses, not just tutorials, but real courses that include lessons, assignments, exams, discussion boards, and actual assessment of your progress. Students receive grades, performance feedback, and the opportunity to earn a certificate to document CEU's (continuing education units). The courses range from career oriented, to hobbies, to personal development. There is no penalty if you start a course, decide it's not for you, and go on to try something else. There is no limit to the number of courses you can sign up for. It's a great way to build your online portfolio. You can also take a course just for fun.

It all starts with registering for a library card. Your card is your key to open the door to something new and life changing. Over the years, the public library has been called "the people's university", and it's true. Where else can you learn at your own pace free of charge?



Monday, May 8th at 3:30pm


Just Us: An American Conversation, by Claudia Rankine
